**Roll Call:**

The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by First Selectman Mone, with Selectman Scheppard also in attendance. Selectman Barrett, Sr. was unable to make the meeting this evening. Deborah Bournival, Administrative Assistant to the First Selectman, was available to take the minutes of the meeting.

**Approval of Minutes:**

A motion was made by Selectman Scheppard to approve the minutes of the January 4, 2011 regular meeting as presented. Motion was seconded by First Selectman Mone. With all in favor, motion carries.

**Monthly Reports:**

Chief Torrence is pleased to announce overtime is down and February is looking pretty good so far. A total of 24 of the 92 hours listed under DWI/Sick/Time Off Requested was due to an officer who was out sick. The 8 hours under Regular/Investigation was time Detective Campbell spent on the recent arrest made in the sexual assault case.

We are down in Alarm calls this month. This has not been a good month for the radar trailer to be out. With all the snow, there is no good place to park it. The 13.50 Radar Hours listed are probably the handheld units in the cruisers.

**Old Business:**

Selectman Scheppard asked Chief Torrence about the status of the citizen's academy program. Chief Torrence said it is still in the planning stages. Looking at spring/summer at this point.
